Interns are exposed to discussions etc. about casework, so do get to see some of the work. The best credentials are a willingness to understand science fundamentals, to have an active curiosity about phenomena and their explanations, and about what we really do not know. The operative word in "forensic science" is science.

Internships can occur throughout the year, not just during the summer.	Graduate students are preferred. All internship applicants must have completed at least two years of higher education progressing toward a degree in a natural science. The start/end dates of internships are decided by mutual agreement between the prospective intern and laboratory prior to the submission of the final application.
